








RESIDENT POPULATION PROJECTIONS













Induced abortions: there has been a sharp reduction since Law n. 194/78 made induced abortions legal in Italy. 1982 and 1983 were the peak years, with a number of interventions exceeding 230,000 per year and an abortion rate of 16.7 and 16.4 per 1,000 resident women aged 15 to 49. From that moment on, the abortion rate progressively reduced to 9 per 1,000

Body Mass Index (BMI): determined dividing the body weight in kilograms by the squared height in meters. A BMI under 18.5 is considered underweight, one of 18.5-24.99 is considered a healthy weight, one of 25-29.99 is overweight and one of 30 or more is obese


INDUCED ABORTIONS

Sport practise: in 2009, 21.5% of population aged 3 and over practiced one or more sports with continuity, while 9.7% did it discontinuously. People who did not do any sport but claimed to perform some physical activity (such as walking, swimming or cycling) amounted to 27.7%. The sedentary, namely those who did not either do any sport or perform any physical activity, rose to 40.6%: 44.8% of women and 36.1% of men.

Sport was the most widespread leisure activity among the young: children aged 6-17, in particular males aged 11-14 (61.1%) practised sport with continuity, while 15.5% of people aged 20-24 did it occasionally

DAILY CONSUMERS of Alcoholic Drinks in 2008













The reform of the university system: as stated in Law n. 127/97 and Law n. 5094/99, academic courses are organised in two cycles according to the so called "3+2" formula:

- the first three-year cycle leads to a 1st level degree;
- the second, two-year cycle, enables students to achieve a 2nd level degree.

The one-long cycle degree courses (5 or 6 years), equivalent to the old system degree courses, are still in force for architecture, civil engineering, pharmacy, dentistry, veterinary science and medicine; the Ministerial order n. 270/2004 included law courses in the above group

UNIVERSITY GRADUATES By Geographical Area* In 2008




















1999-2009, percentage of GDP







The category also includes undertakings exclusively engaged in livestock raising without farmland. It does not include companies belonging to government agencies, to private non-profit institutions, communities, collective leaseholds and undertakings exclusively engaged in forestry

Annual Working Unit (AWU): is defined as the work volume corresponding to one full-time employed worker. In agriculture, it is equivalent to 280 days actually worked on the holding



Harvest and use of grapes: 64.4 millions of quintals of wine grapes [+6.7% over 2007] and 13.7 millions of quintals of table grapes [+1.0%] were harvested in 2008. The production of wine and must was of 46.2 millions of hectolitres. The 2008 production of wines with D.O.C. 






MAIN ECONOMIC INDICATORS OF ENTERPRISES BY SECTOR OF ACTIVITY AND SIZE




