Poverty in Italy 2012

Istat disseminates the relative and absolute poverty estimations for the households residing in Italy, based on 2012 Households Budget Survey data. Being sample estimations, they are affected by sampling error: small differences can be not statistically significant.

In 2012 the relative poverty incidence was equal to 12.7%, whereas the absolute poverty to 6.8%. Taking into account the sampling error, the phenomenon increased in comparison with 2011 in all the geographical areas.

The relative poverty threshold, for a two-member household, was equal to 990.88 Euros (about 20 euros less compared with 2011 threshold).


Absolute poverty increased among households with three (from 4.7% to 6.6%), four (from 5.2% to 8.3%) and five or more members (from 12.3% to 17.2%); among couples with three or more children- the incidence from 10.4% increased to 16.2% - especially if the children are minors (from 10.9% to 17.1%). The absolute poverty increased among single parents (from 5.8% to 9.1%) and households with aggregate members (from 10.4% to 13.3%).

The condition worsened, in terms of absolute poverty, for households having as reference person a worker (from 7.5% to 9.4%), a self employed worker (from 4.2% to 6%), a manager or an employee (from 1.3% to 2.6%) and for households with employed and retired members (from 3.6% to 5.3%).


The growth of absolute poverty is more evident among households with not employed reference person: the incidence increased from 8.4% to 11.3% if in other condition, from 15.5% to 23.6% if seeking employment.

Relative poverty confirms many of the trends observed for absolute poverty: households with one or two children, specially if they are minors (from 13.5% to 15.7% with one minor, from 16.2% to 20.1% with two minors); households where all components are employed (from 4.1% to 5.1%), with employed and retired components (from 9.3% to 11.5%), households headed by a manager or an employee (from 4.4% to 6.5%, especially employee), but mostly headed by a person seeking employment (from 27.8% to 35.6%).

Poverty decreased only in terms of relative poverty for single elderly (aged 65 years and over): the incidence from 10.1% decreased to 8.6%.



Graph. 1 Relative poverty by geographical area. Years 2009-2012 (percentage values)





ECONOMIC CYCLE AND POVERTY LINE

The relative poverty line depends year by year on variations both of consumer prices and of the mean of consumption expenditure. On analyzing the relative poverty variation both aspects are to be taken into account. In 2012, the relative poverty line was 990.88 Euros (around 20 Euros lower than the 2011 line). The 2011 poverty line re-evaluated in accordance with the national inflation rate (+3%) is 1,041.36 Euros; the poverty incidence, with this line, is 14.2% (3 millions and 592 thousand poor households) and it is statistically higher than the incidence obtained by the 2012 standard poverty line. This outcome is the effect observed in the North and in the South and Island areas, where the incidence obtained by the re-evaluated 2011 poverty line is 7%

and 28.8% respectively.


