

## Poverty in Italy

## Year 2009

Istat disseminates the relative and absolute poverty estimations for the households residing in Italy, based on 2009 Households Budget Survey data. Being sample estimations, they are affected by sampling error: small differences can be not statistically significant.


In 2009 the relative poverty incidence was equal to 10.8%, whereas the absolute poverty to 4.7%. Taking into account the sampling error, the phenomenon was stable in comparison with 2008. The South and the Islands confirmed the incidence levels reached in 2008 (22.7% for relative poverty, 7.7% for absolute poverty) and it showed an increase for the absolute poverty intensity (from 17.3% to 18.8%): the number of absolutely poor households stays almost the same, but their average conditions worsened.

The poverty incidence increased, from 2008 to 2009, among the households with a worker as reference person, both in relative (in the Centre from 7.9% to 11.3%) and in absolute terms (at the national level from 5.9% to 6.9%).

In Italy, the incidence decreased among the households headed by a self-employed, from 11.2% to 8.7% for relative poverty, and from 4.5% to 3.0% for absolute poverty, households more concentrated in the North in comparison with 2008.

In 2009, the relative poverty line was equal to 983.01 Euros, almost 17 Euros lower than the 2008 line. In 2009, in fact, the consumption expenditure showed a decrease in real terms, more marked for households with medium-high expenditure levels (see "Households consumption. Year 2009 <a href="http://en.istat.it/salastampa/comunicati/in calendario/consfam/20100705\_00/">http://en.istat.it/salastampa/comunicati/in calendario/consfam/20100705\_00/</a>). The condition of the households with the lowest expenditure levels didn't get worse in comparison with the other households (see "Economic cycle and poverty line" paragraph).

The poverty stability observed for the crisis year is the consequence of the job market and deprivation conditions in 2009 (see "Annual report. The state of the Nation in 2009" <a href="http://en.istat.it/dati/catalogo/20100625\_00/">http://en.istat.it/dati/catalogo/20100625\_00/</a>); in this year, in fact, 80% of the employment decrease involved young people, mainly living with their parents, whereas two fundamental social shock-absorbers softened the crisis effects on the household: the household itself, which protected the young people having lost the job, and the short-allowance payment (CIG), which protected the parents (they represent the majority among people receiving short-allowance payment).

## ECONOMIC CYCLE AND POVERTY LINE

The relative poverty line depends year by year on variations both of consumer prices and of the mean of consumption expenditure.

On analysing the relative poverty variation it is necessary taking into account both the aspects. In 2009, the relative poverty line is 983.01

The 2008 poverty line re-evaluated in accordance with the national inflation rate (+0.8%) is 1,007.67 Euros and the poverty incidence, with this line, is 11.7% (2,880 thousand poor households).

The two estimates difference represents the number of households, almost 223 thousand, with a consumption expenditure level higher than the 2009 poverty line, but lower than the re-evaluated 2008 poverty line. In other words, they represent the households with expenditure levels slightly lower, at constant prices, than the 2008 level, but that are non poor if the decrease of the average life condition of the population is taken into account.



Graph 4. Absolute poverty by geographical area. Year 2006-2009 (percentage values)


