FINAL BALANCE SHEETS OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENTS Year 2011

The analysis of Municipal-level final balance certificates and local financing in particular falls within the context of ISTAT's statistical framework on general governments.

The provisional estimations presented in the following statistical summary are based on information from Ministry of the Interior data banks.

Revenue accounts by economic category

The total revenue assessed by municipal governments during fiscal year 2011 was estimated at 77,249 million euros (Table 1). This general total does not include the *revenue of third-party contractors*.

The total assessed revenue breaks down into 74.4 percent current revenues, 17.7 percent capital revenue and the remaining 7.9 percent for revenue derived from the opening of lines of credit.

Relative to the data for 2010, tax assessments decreased by 2.0 percent and total tax collection remained stable. Collections in accrual accounts grew from 52,716 million euros in 2010 to 52,897 million euros in 2011 (+0.3 percent), while residual accounts dropped from 21,429 million euros to 21,060 million euros (-1.7 percent). Tax collection capacity in 2011, as measured by the ratio between taxes collected in accrual accounts and tax assessments, was equal to 68.5 percent (rising from the previous year).

Analyzing the weights of each single entry relative to total tax assessments reveals an increase – with reference to the previous year – only current revenues (+1.7 percentage points), while in both opening of lines of credit and capital revenue fell by 1.2 and 0.5 percentage points, respectively.

In 2011, the total for current revenue assessments was 57,464 million euros, remaining stable relative to the previous fiscal year. This result reflects the growth of tributary revenues (+52.3 percent) and non-tributary revenues (+4.6 percent), while contributions and transfers fell by 50.6 percent.

The collection of current revenues fell (-0.9 percent). Within this category, both the revenues from tributary and non-tributary revenues reflected an increase (+51.4 and +7.8 percent, respectively). Revenues from contributions and transfers dropped off (-51.4 percent).

A total of 13,662 million euros of capital revenues were assessed, down by 4.6 percent relative to 2010. This figure breaks down into an increase in asset transfers and in credit collection (+23.9 percent and +11.0 percent, respectively), while transfers fell by 11.3 percent.

Collections of capital revenues reached 12,561 million euros, remaining stable relative to 2010. This can mostly be attributed to the reductions recorded in transfers-derived (-7.8 percent), while asset transfers revenues (+32.1 percent) and credit collection (+11.4 percent) grew.

In 2011 the average per capita value of current revenues assessed at the national level (Table 2) was 968 euros per inhabitant, which was up 23 euros over the previous year's value. Municipal governments in the whole country registered per capita levels that were below the national average, except for municipalities of Valle d'Aosta-Vallée d'Aoste (1,957 euros), Trentino-Alto Adige/Südtirol (1,555 euros), Friuli-Venezia Giulia (1,301 euros), Lazio (1,236 euros), Sardegna (1,224 euros), Liguria (1,216 euros), Abruzzo (1,041 euros) and Toscana (973 euros). The values registered in the municipalities of Puglia representing the lowest value (723 euros per inhabitant).

Expenditure account by economic category

In 2011 the overall total for expenditure commitments was estimated to be 77,409 million euros (Table 3).

Total payments amounted to 74,571 million euros, of which 49,504 was accrual accounts with a consequent spending capacity of 64.0 percent. Relative to 2010, commitments presented a decrease (-1.7 percent), while payments grew by 1.1 percent, with an increased spending capacity (+2.7 percentage points). Current expenditure commitments totaled to 54,056 million euros, with 39,140 million euros of payments on accrual accounts. Spending capacity, therefore, was equal to 72.4 percent, reflecting an increase over the previous year. In comparison to 2010, current commitments presented a slight increase by 0.5 percent and current payments grew by 1.2 percent.

Commitments in capital accounts amounted to 15,976 million euros, with corresponding accrual payments of 3,841 million euros. This resulted in a spending capacity of 24.0 percent, which is 4.9 percentage points higher than the value reported the previous year. Relative to 2010, commitments and payments on capital accounts dropped by 12.1 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively.

In 2011, current per capita expenditures were 910 euros at the national level (Table 4), reflecting an increase of 23 euros relative to the previous fiscal year. The values recorded for municipal governments in the North, in the Centre and in the Islands were lower than the national average, with the exception of those in Valle d'Aosta-Vallée d'Aoste, Trentino-Alto Adige/Südtirol, Lazio, Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Liguria, Sardegna e Abruzzo.

In the northern and central regions, the highest levels of per capita expenditures were found in the municipal governments of the autonomous regions with special statutes and the autonomous Provinces – Valle d'Aosta-Vallée d'Aoste (1,662 euros) and Trentino-Alto Adige/Südtirol (1,292 euros). From among the regions with ordinary statutes there was Lazio (1,240 euros). The per capita values for all southern regions fell below the national average except for the municipal governments of Sardegna and Abruzzo, which registered an average value of 1,108 euros and 959 euros, respectively (which are above the national average). The lowest value (678 euros per inhabitant) was recorded in the municipalities of Puglia.

Expenditure accounts by functional category

Data regarding the final expenditures (including both current and capital account expenditures) of municipal governments were also analyzed in terms of the functional category employed in the final balance sheets (Table 5).

As witnessed in previous fiscal years, 2011 expenditures for the general administration function accounted for the largest proportion of final commitments (28.9 percent), which nevertheless reflects a 0.3 percentage point of increase relative to 2010. When combined with expenditures for territorial and environmental management (20.9 percent), this grouping represents nearly the half of the final municipal government expenditures. As in previous years, significant proportions of expenditures were also designated for the road condition and transport function (14.7 percent), the social sector (13.4 percent) and public education (9.1 percent). The residual 13 percent was divided among the other functions that were taken into consideration. As a whole, the final expenditures committed by municipalities exhibited a decrease relative to 2010 (-2.7 percent).

Economic-structural indicators

To facilitate the analysis of results related to the economic-financial management of municipal governments, different economic-structural indicators were disaggregated by region and demographic size class (Table 6).

This involves composition ratios that use economic aggregates that refer to assessments of revenue and expenditure commitments.

For municipal governments in Italy as a whole, the average **degree of taxation autonomy** was 58.1 percent (+19.8 percentage points relative to the previous year).

The **degree of financial autonomy**, equal to 79.9 percent at the national level, showed a growth relative to 2010 (59.1 percent for the 2010 fiscal year).

As for the **degree of tax dependence**, 2011 exhibited a decrease relative to previous fiscal years. On average, 7.3 percent of the current revenues of Italian municipal governments came from state contributions and transfers (-20.2 percentage points relative to 2010).

The **degree of structural rigidity** of municipal expenditures was equal to 40.7 percent on average, which represents a slight increase relative to 2010 (40.4 percent).

Lastly, **the incidence of personal expenditures** on current municipal revenue, equal to 27.8 percent at the Italian level, showed a decrease relative to the previous fiscal year.

Informative note

The data source for this statistical summary is the certified balance sheet that all municipal governments are required to publish on an annual basis to certify their primary accounting data for the previous fiscal year, The certification of municipal balance sheets, the structure of which is defined in *Presidential Decree no.194 of 31.01.1996*, details the financial flows of salaries and cash flow for the main economic categories and revenue and expenditure items,

For fiscal year 2011, data for these provisional estimations were available for 6,992 municipal governments, Value estimations for the universe of municipalities were based on resident populations as of 31.12.2011 using coefficients of expansion for each resident population class of each region (Table 7).
