

Hours worked, job vacancies and labour cost

III quarter 2013

Hours worked

Hours worked in enterprises with at least 10 employees in industry and services are calculated as per capita indices with base year 2010 and with reference to the Ateco 2007 classification (the Italian edition of the Nace Rev. 2).

In the third quarter of 2013 seasonally adjusted per capita hours worked for the business economy decreased by 0.1% with respect to the previous quarter (+0.8% in industry and -0.8% in business services).

Working day adjusted per capita hours worked for the business economy decreased by 0.3% with respect to the same quarter of 2012 (+1.0% in industry and -1.4% in business services).

Unadjusted per capita hours in the total of industry and services increased by 0.6% with respect to the same quarter of 2012 (+2.2% in industry and -0.5% in services).

Job vacancies

A job vacancy is a paid post which can be newly created, unoccupied or about to become vacant, for which the employer is taking active steps and is prepared to take further steps to find a suitable candidate from outside the enterprise concerned.

The job vacancy rate is the percentage ratio between vacancies and the sum of vacancies and occupied posts (both measured at the end of the reference quarter).

The data refer to enterprises with at least 10 employees.

In the third quarter of 2013 the job vacancy rate for both the total of industry and services and the business economy was 0.4%, unchanged with respect to the same quarter of 2012.

Labour cost

Since first quarter 2013, gross wages and labour cost indices are calculated with reference to the base year 2010 using the Ateco 2007 classification (Italian edition of NACE Rev. 2).

In the third quarter 2013 the seasonally adjusted index of labour cost per full time equivalent (fte) increased by 0.6% in business economy compared to the previous quarter (+0.5% in industry and +0.8% in services of the business economy). The unadjusted index rose by 2.4% in business economy compared to the third quarter 2012 (+2.9% in industry and +1.9% in services of the business economy), and 2.2% in total industry and services.
