

# Poverty in Italy 2017

### Absolute poverty

In 2017, the incidence of absolute poverty was 6.9% in terms of residing households (1 million and 778 thousand households) and 8.4% in terms of individuals (5 million and 58 thousand households). In 2016 the former was 6.3% and the latter 7.9%.

The incidence of absolute poverty at the household level increased with respect to 2016; it particularly increased among households in the South and Islands area (from 8.5% in 2016 to 10.3%), and among households with one minor child (from 7.2% to 9.5%). In 2017 the incidence of poverty among individuals increased with respect to 2016 with higher values in the South and Islands area (11.4%, 2 million and 359 thousand persons).

The share of poor households exclusively composed by non-nationals was almost six times higher than that of poor households composed by nationals only (29.2% vs. 5.1%).


Households residing in metropolitan municipalities of the South and Islands area showed worsening signals (incidence of absolute poverty from 5.8% in 2016 to 10,1% in 2017).

Professional condition is a crucial determinant of the absolute poverty incidence that decreases in the households where the reference person is employed (from 6.4% in 2016 to 6.1%) and increases in the households where the reference person is not employed (from 6.1% to 7.7%). Nevertheless, in the households where the reference person is a worker, the incidence of absolute poverty (11.8%) is more than double than in the households where the reference person is retired (4.2%).

### Relative poverty

In 2017, the percentage of poor households in relative terms increased with respect to 2016 (12.3% in 2017 from 10.6% in 2016), the same for poor individuals (15.6% in 2017 from 14.0% in 2016). Households in relative poverty were 3 million and 171 thousand, individuals were 9 million and 368 thousand in 2017.

Graph 2. Relative poverty (households) by geographical area. Years 2014-2017 (percentage values)



# ECONOMIC CYCLE AND POVERTY LINE

The relative poverty line depends year by year on variations both of consumer prices and of the mean of consumption expenditure. On analysing the relative poverty

variation it is necessary to take into account both aspects. In 2017, the relative poverty line was 1,085.22 euros (12.3%, 3 million and 171 thousand poor households), about 24 euros more than 2016.

The 2016 poverty line re-evaluated in accordance


with the national inflation rate (+1.2%) is 1,074.09 Euros; the poverty incidence, with this line, is 11.9% (3 million and 72 thousand poor households)

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### **Methodological Note**

This Report disseminates estimates based on the renewed Household Budget Survey, that is designed to measure and analyze expenditure behaviors of households residing in Italy according to their main social, economic and territorial characteristics (for further details please <a href="https://www.istat.it/en/archivio/217360">https://www.istat.it/en/archivio/217360</a>, Household consumption expenditure).

The estimate of the absolute poverty defines as poor a household with a consumption expenditure lower or equal to the monetary value of a basket of goods and services considered as essential to avoid severe forms of social exclusion.

Essential requirements are identified in adequate nutrition, availability of a dwelling and minimum necessary to dress, communicate, learn, move, recreate and be in good health.

The monetary value of the basket of absolute poverty varies according to household member socio-demographic characteristics (number; age), geographical area of residence and municipality demographic size, so that there are many absolute poverty thresholds, not a single one.

The values of monthly absolute poverty thresholds, for selected household typologies (detailed by number and age of components), by geographical area and municipality type, can be calculated at: http://www.istat.it/it/prodotti/contenuti-interattivi/calcolatori/soglia-di-poverta

Last, the monetary value of the basket is reviewed every year in the light of trend in prices and compared to the levels of spending on household consumption.

The estimate of the relative poverty is based on a poverty line (International Standard of Poverty Line - ISPL) defining as poor a household of two components with a consumption expenditure level lower or equal to the mean per-capita consumption expenditure.

To define the relative poverty line for different household sizes an equivalence scale is used (Carbonaro equivalence scale) to take into account different needs and economies/diseconomies of scale that can be achieved in bigger/smaller households.

For Italy, the Carbonaro equivalence scale is used, that assigns a unitary weight to a two-member household.

For both poverty measures (absolute and relative), the assumption is that household resources are equally shared among all the household members, so that individuals in a poor family are all equally poor.

To summarise information on different poverty aspects (spread, gravity) two indices are calculated.

The first is the proportion of the poor (incidence), that is the ratio between the number of households (individuals) in poverty and the number of resident households (individuals).

The second is the mean poverty gap (intensity), measuring 'how poor are the poor', that is, in percentage terms, the difference between the mean consumption expenditures of poor households and the monetary value of the basket of absolute poverty/the poverty line.
