



ISLP Poster Competition 2018–2019 Rules

Who can take part?

- Teams of 2–5 students (we do not allow posters made by only one student)
- Three divisions:
 - students born in 2002 and younger
 - students born in 1999 and younger
 - undergraduate students in university (no age limit)
 - Posters must be submitted by teachers to the Country Coordinators (islp2018@istat.it)
- Free entry

When?

- National competitions
 - Registration of participating students by teachers **1 September-14 December 2018**
 - Posters submitted to the Country Coordinators **by 18th January 2019**
 - National winners announced **by 8th March 2019**
- International competition
 - Prizes awarded at 62nd ISI World Statistics Congress Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, **18-23 August 2019**

Posters

- There is no particular theme or topic required for a poster to be eligible. However, posters should reflect or illustrate usage, analysis, interpretation and communication of statistics or statistical information and findings. In planning the projects on which posters are based, it is important to take into account the judging rules of the ISLP Poster Competition, which clarify these educational goals.
- Data used can be collected by students or previously published by someone else (if the data is published, the source must be cited in the poster).
- Winning posters at national level must be sent to the International Jury in English, Therefore we suggest to also prepare an electronic version in English.
- Posters must be blind i.e. they must not contain any information about students or schools who have submitted them.
- Posters from previous international competitions are not allowed.
- Posters must be the original design and creation of students.
- Posters must be on paper for the Italian version and in digital form for the English one.
- Posters must be two-dimensional (one single sheet) and one-sided: maximum size is A1 (841 mm x 594 mm) and maximum file size is 10 MB. In case of an electronic poster, the font size should be such that if it was printed in A1, it would be readable from 2 meters away.
- All entries for the international competition become the property of the ISI and will not be returned. By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed at various ISI conferences, special events, in publications and promotional material, and in electronic format on the internet.
- All entries for the national competition become the property of Istat and SIS and will not be returned. By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed by the two Institutions at conferences, special events, in publications and promotional material, and in electronic format on the internet.
 - Posters received after the established deadline will not be considered for the competition.
