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Cultural occupations in Italy¹

Piro Dishnica

Abstract

The main contribution of this report is the updating of the work and the context for cultural occupations, in terms of evolution, relations and mapping to ISCO-08 based on the recent release of the Italian Statistical Classification of Occupations (April 2011), developed by Istat. This work defines the cultural domains that have been selected, and structures two types of semantic metadata (producer's statistical metadata and users' metadata) and tries to bring them together. Other than supplying inputs and technical description on recent evolutions the matter of cultural occupations in Italy (as requested by the ESSnet project), this report makes possible to use a common language that is recognised by Member States, in order to produce and publish a base of comparable cultural occupation data and metadata at four digit (instead of three) in the near future. Moreover, it might be helpful to the continuous development of the Information System of Occupations (released by Istat on fall 2010) when considering the increase and extension of the number and type of users and their requirements for data and metadata on the matter of cultural occupations (from statistical and non statistical viewpoint).

1. Statistical Classification and the Information system of Occupations

The classification variable described in the Italian Statistical Classification of Occupations is the occupation. Jobs are the observable units assigned to one unique category of the classification of occupations without reference to any other observable unit. The statistical unit, the job, is defined as a set of activities carried out concretely by the individuals that request skills, competencies, identities and proper statuses characterised by a high degree of similarity criteria.

1.1 Criterion

Skill level:

It contains the formal education and previous and demonstrated experience (different from formal education). These first set of measures used remain the same as in the previous edition (2001). They are combined with four operating measures of skill specialisation.

It is to be noted that skill level, in the Italian Statistical Classification of Occupations, is an attribute of occupations and not an attribute of the particular individuals who hold jobs in those occupations. To classify the occupation "Museum curator and conservator" (2.5.4.5.3) to a given skill level in the Classification structure it is necessary to consider the amount of formal education and the

demonstrated experience that is usually required for an individual to gain entry to that occupation. In other terms, when coding jobs to the Classification it is not relevant whether a given or particular individual working as a "Museum curator and conservator" has this amount of formal education or training or practiced relevant experience or qualification. Nor is it relevant whether the individual is an extremely competent, an average, or a scarce museum curator and/or conservator. Finally, it is important to note as well that, for some occupations, registration or licensing may be required. The individual's job would be classified to the occupation "Museum curator and conservator" and the job would be assigned that Classification code (5th level of the second major group).² In the context of Culture domain, some occupations such as visual arts and crafts professionals, designers, authors, musicians, film, Tv, radio and stage directors, actors, dancers, media presenters, etc. (may) require high levels of creative talent, interests or personal specific commitment as well as or in place of formal qualification or demonstrated relevant experience in terms of a given number of years. In this latter, the particular artistic skills and competencies prevail (such as the talent for painting and drawing, musical talent, creativity, acting talent, imitative ability, trend and fashion and consciousness, etc.). That means, no specific classification coding on this matter (talents or artistic skills) is built.

Entry requirements:

As it is known, the determination of the skill level of each occupation requires some subjective judgement. As a result of the 2011 updating of the Italian Statistical Classification of Occupations, the skill level statements provided in the occupation and group definitions represent the best judgement of the coordination group (Istat and Isfol - the Institute for workers vocational training development) and should be interpreted as indicative only.

The four skill levels in the Italian Statistical Classification of Occupations are defined as follows: Skill Level 1 (corresponding to the major group 8 of the classification)

Most occupations have a level of skill commensurate with a core literacy degree (primary school graduation) or higher qualification.

Skill Level 2 (corresponding to the major groups 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the classification) Most occupations have a level of skill commensurate with a compulsory school completition (actually it is 10 years of academic school) which is composed by lower secondary school graduation, the first two years of upper secondary school plus any kind of eventual of vocational training qualification (short term).

Skill Level 3 (corresponding to the major group 3 and eventually 1 of the classification)

Most occupations have a level of skill commensurate with an Upper secondary school graduation (5 year), post upper secondary school qualification, University graduation (short and medium cycle).

Skill Level 4 (corresponding to the major group 2 and eventually 1 of the classification)

Most occupations have a level of skill commensurate with an University graduation (long duration), post-university qualification (conditional to university graduation).

It is important to note that although the newly released statistical classification on occupations applies the same criterion on skill level as in the previous version, judgements about the actual skill level of an occupation may not always concur with the views of all users. In some instances it has been necessary to place occupations in major groups which may have a higher or lower skill level, since a very rigid application of the skill level criterion would result in very dissimilar or dissimilar occupations being grouped together, i.e. grouping at the same skill level the occupations corresponding to an upper secondary school graduation to the ones referring to a short or medium university graduation.

Skill specialisation:

The definition of skill specialisation remains unchanged from the previous edition of the classification. It includes reference to non-production based operations referred as "goods or services

provided". For example, in the culture domain, tools and equipment can also include all forms of computer-based equipment, personal interaction, and art or design techniques. Materials worked on can also include data and individual or group service.

The four dimensions which comprise the skill specialisation are defined as follows:

Field of knowledge required: This is the subject matter knowledge which is essential for satisfactory performance of the tasks of an occupation.

Tools and equipment used: This includes all forms of plant, machinery, computer-based equipment or hand tools used in the performance of the tasks, as well as intellectual tools such as personal interaction, and art or design techniques.

Materials worked on: This refers to materials of both a concrete and abstract nature which are extracted, processed, transformed, refined or fabricated as an essential part of the tasks performed. Examples of materials worked on include wood, metal, textile, paper, accounting data, text, people and organisations.

Goods or services provided: This refers to the end product of the performance of the tasks of an occupation including physical goods, personal or other services, or abstract goods such as a software application or (statistical) information.

The Classification has a structure which defines some groups of categories as subdivisions of others. The strategy is to arrange the content in such a way that aggregations of the most detailed categories in the set are based upon similarity criteria that are meaningful for statistical and other analytic comparisons. The rule is that when the main activities carried out concretely by the individuals (as referred in ISCO-88: tasks and duties of a set of jobs) are characterized by a high degree of similarity, then these jobs are classified to the same detailed category. These set of activities define an occupation, which is the designation for the most detailed element in the set of categories of this classification. The structure of the 2011 Classification makes possible to identify relevant individual categories uniquely and separately, starting from the lowest, 5th digit code (level), yet still be able to present statistics for meaningful broader groupings. Explicit statements of tasks (and so on for other levels on the basis of similarity criteria used for aggregation) and detailed explanations are the basis for drawing distinctions between groups are supplied, trying to avoid as much as possible how to classify and understand cases not explicitly dealt with when defining the scope of the different groups. The 6th level of the classification lists the most common and detailed skills and competences in terms of specialisation being part of 3 (painters and sculptors). No tasks or descriptions are developed at this point. Occupations Units including "nec" professionals (not elsewhere classified) do not exist (in terms of occupations included in this or that group).

The logic that the Classification makes use is the similarity criteria to define higher level categories. As already mentioned, the main similarity criteria are the skill level and skill specializations needed to carry out the activities of the jobs, where skill level is kept as the main criterion to delineate the most aggregate categories, while skill specialization is used to delineate the more detailed categories within the aggregate categories. The actual classification is articulated on 5 levels of aggregation: the first level represents the most synthetic one, i.e. 9 major groups and then the second level contains 37 occupation groups subdivided in 129 classes (third level). The fourth level and the fifth one are respectively structured in 511 categories and 800 occupation units. At their turn, the

This list can not be considered exhaustive. In reference to the occupation unit "Painters and sculptors" (code 2.5.5.1.1) there are the following 6th level items:

occupation units(the lowest level of the classification) can be considered as the closest units to the existing professions (in their all meaning and degree of detail as skills and/or competencies) the Classification developed for statistical purposes may provide in order to map the labour market running professions.

The overall content of the Classification is shown as in the following table:

The Italian statistical classification of occupations (existing from 1951 year) is described on the basis of one to one or "simple" model describing mappings to ISCO-08 at 3rd level in terms of comparability (cross-national). No direct relations to NACE or other variables stay behind the model. It remains a difficult process the cross-national comparison, due to eventual misinterpretations. Actually, the Classification provides detailed descriptions at each item of its 5th level (occupation unit). This becomes crucial when mappings from national level are carried out to ISCO-08. The classification allows better to examine in some detail the nature of these mappings, with particular attention to "culture". Otherwise, in the resulting statistical data one cannot then distinguish between statistical differences which arise from differences in the interpretation of the classification and the differences between countries in terms of their skill structure. The 80,2% of items of the actual edition of the Classification refer to the previous edition. The Labour Force Survey remains the main source for updating the statistical classification of occupations (6,1%) followed by administrative records on "contracts", 5,6% and the Commission of the classification, 3,5%.

Testing of the Classification

By means of a sample survey on occupations (2006/2007 and 2011/2012), the classification is submitted under a testing process. Twenty occupied persons per each of 800 Classification occupation units are CAPI interviewed. The minimum and maximum number of questions varies from 283 to 448, some questions are conditional to some others prior ones. The survey is carried out in order to identify the information concerning the occupation as in the following list:

- 1. skill level (necessary skills in order to carry out correctly the requested work):
- 2. skill specialisation (competencies used while exercising the profession in connection to the tasks assigned);

- 3. attitudes to work;
- 4. work values and work styles;
- 6. generalised work activities;
- 7. work context and specific/detailed work activities.

1.2 Relationships between the Statistical Classification and the Information System of Occupations (released on fall 2010)

Thanks to the recent developments of web technology, the information system on occupations comes out from the opportunity to make available and to bring together all information collected on occupations from a large group of public entities. The concept of the project is to share in areas of significance other than they have been created, various types of information that frame the social and economic context as well as the conditions under which the occupations are practically created and performed and excerced within the domestic labour market. Thus, the information system of occupations as well as the statistical classification become a focal point and a source of information on the various aspects of professions and it is related to the job seekers, job offers, helping both employers to define the set of skills and competencies required for a job, support the development of new employment and training initiatives, provide a common reference for institutions and stakeholders in the labour market and education sector at national and regional level throughout the country, improve access to information on what type of occupation is available, and the gap between the needed entry requirements in terms of skill and competence to profess a given job and the concrete amount of knowledge and experience in possess of a given jobseeker.

There may be a number of possible entry routes in the Information system of occupations, and in these cases the occupation and group definitions attempt to identify the entry routes, the reasons and the users. Aiming to answer how, one may find that some users need statistics according to the classification to determine who and how many will be impacted by policies or programmes being considered

The bodies/partners who contribute to the information system of occupations are:

- the Ministry of Labour and Social Policy:
- the Ministry of Education, University and Research;
- · the National Statistical Institute of Statistics (ISTAT), the developer and custodian of the statistical classification of occupations
- · the Institute for workers vocational training development (Isfol);
- the National Insurance Institute on Labour accidents (INAIL);
- the Chambers of Commerce Union;
- the Basilicata Region;

the Regulatory authority (professional register) of agro-technicians and graduated agrotechnicians.

There are two basic aspects that characterize the entire information system of occupations: from one side, the information released by the system where it "resides" is "accessed" through the websites of the provider organization. By doing so, the owner keeps its visibility and accountability, and from the other side, these sites, at the same time constitute the gateways to the information system as a whole. Both of these aspects define the information system of the occupations in terms of a browsing environment running under systems designed and developed for different purposes. This solution facilitates the sharing of information available by each of these systems with important extension possibilities towards the increased number of users.

The project's target:

- statisticians/experts (producers/users of the statistical classification on occupations) having the awareness on the matter;
- researchers coming from the universities and education (educational offer)
- individuals, job seekers
- operators and labour market analysts (existing and new)
- agencies and consultants on the matter of professional orientation (existing and new)
- employers, entrepreneurs and social security institutes;
- persons looking for a given vocational education.

From the information system point of view, the users (not necessarily statistical) can be grouped on at least in two main types or categories:

- statistical users (the classification is a well known tool and understood in different aspects), in other terms, these are aware experts who are familiar to the use of standard statistical classification on occupations directly as it proposed by the information system;
- non-statistical users that, for obvious reasons, have a greater interest and willingness to interact with the information system through
 simple lists, so they prefer to have a list rather than a very articulated classification (as it should be from the statistical point of view).

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The project is the result of a long process of intra-institutional collaboration between the National Statistical Institute (Istat) and the Institute for workers vocational training development (Isfol) and represents one of the main Isfol's activities in monitoring the occupational needs. The necessary condition to take part in the system is that the information that one organization agrees to render available to the public is still organized or may be organized according to the current edition of the Classification of Occupations released by ISTAT in collaboration with Isfol: in fact, this is the standard by which the participating bodies, as soon as have agreed upon the release of their information, this latter becomes sharable within the information system.

(i.e. education reform, training and education orientation, etc.); others need these statistics to implement policies; others want to monitor the consequences of policies and programmes and others want to make use of the classification when offering or seeking job within the Italian market labour, including the cultural occupational sectors (entirely cultural, mainly or poorly). In all cases, as it is known, aiming to answer who are the users and their expectations require instigating a search. It is very important to note that as soon as the number and type of users (and their respective needs) increase, the classification's representations relations and the in-depth research on the matter become a significant responsibility for the classification's custodian (as producer) for the present and for the future development of the classification. Moving through "traditional" users of a statistical classification of occupations to "new and diversified" users of an Information system of occupations is a big challenge.

The Italian statistical standard classification of occupations, despite its simple model (one to one) and beside the mapping to ISCO (International Classification Standard of Occupations) in the framework of cross-national comparisons, in the case when it should used by a large set of users interested in mapping their needs (not necessarily based to a one to one model and resulting statistics), it requires further research and actions in order to become even more direct or to make possible the integration of other parameters, starting with the sector of activity, the size of the unit where the work is done, etc.. The existing model should be revised and eventually re-modelled.

2. Culture occupations

In Italy, a definition of culture for statistical purposes doesn't exist.

However, the Italian Statistical Yearbook on culture provides the main statistical data on production, distribution and to cultural participation in Italy. It describes the phenomena and trends that characterize the cultural sector supplying knowledge on the current situation and providing inputs for the analysis of various players and the cultural activities in Italy. In particular, this yearbook contains information on:

- 1. cultural heritage (administrative information on museums, galleries, monuments, archaeological sites and museum circuits, designed to describe the main features of museums, the users and related incomes):
- 2. archives (administrative data on the distribution, features, management methods and the users of the State archives system);
- 3. publishing (statistical survey data collection on the matter of print publishing books in Italy);
- 4. libraries (administrative data on the public library system and in particular on the material preserved, the services provided and the level of use);
- 5. live performing (administrative data on theatrical and musical performances and the related audience);
- 6. audio video media (administrative information on the major AV media communication means such as television, radio and cinema);
- 7. sport (administrative data on levels of participation in various sport activities and events).

In addition to, in correspondence to the above mentioned domains, data on cultural consumption are published. These statistical results are measured by means of a statistical yearly sampling survey on households "Aspects of Daily Life" and other household surveys.

Testing the information system of occupations from this point of view, means to demonstrate that more reliable information requested by the users can be obtained by using several questions/terms with system response categories (search engines) which need to be combined to generate the corresponding unit/category of the classification requested (of which culture domains are part of). When using categories as jumping levels to search the needed item of the statistical classification, it is expected a more reliable response result if the labels referring to skills and competencies are chosen to correspond to every-day language rather than the technical language used in the statistical classifications and the unit of measure of it (occupation unit), as the technical terms' more precise meaning may not be understood correctly by a (significant) proportion of users.

2.1 Culture domains

In that context, in order to delineate the set of "culture" occupations in the framework of the European research, the primary statistical source is the classification of occupations and its detailed descriptions based on the given criteria as well as the users' requirements (with their pros and cons). The other input is the list of goods and services that really help for that selection. Other mappings between CPA, CN and NACE are attentively consulted. The Final report of the LEG (2000) and the 2009 UNESCO manual on culture – recently approved and published - have been considered and studied as well.

Without pretending to determine the boundaries of culture (in terms of a definition for statistical purposes), but considering that at this stage of the ESSnet Culture research and its main provisional or intermediate outcomes, a broad list of professions dealing directly or in association with other non cultural occupations would help to get closer to national running models and practices on the matter and of course contribute or learn better during the feasibility demonstrations of the European research.

Culture goods and services are mainly matter of the following domains:⁷

- Audio video Media (distribution included) Film, television and radio
- Archaeology
- Restoration (works of art, historical objects)
- Fine arts and design (arts)
- Music and performing arts
- Musical instrument making, repair and maintenance
- Stage design and event technology
- Pre-press, print and bookbinding
- Publishing and literature
- Photography
- Craftwork
- Archives, libraries, museums
- Education: pedagogy and teaching methodology
- Translating and interpreting
- Journalism
- Architectural maintenance and landscape design
- Fashion design and artistic exhibition
- General artistic knowledge and skills
- Cultural and media management

The 5th level of statistical classification of occupations is the reference system of this report. Mappings to ISCO-08 (both from the skill level and skill specialisation) are provided. Some information is provided in order to understand better this edition of classification in relation to the previous one. All descriptions are translated in English, trying to keep as much as possible simple and clear most of the main tasks. It is possible to mark most of the basic action verbs, but this is not definitively completed. In order to facilitate the information system users' requirements, the thesaurus of skills and competencies per each "culture" occupation unit (5th level) is structured as descriptive metadata or term, taking into account user's semantic metadata, with aim to put together (statistical) producer semantic metadata and information system users' semantic metadata in order make more easier the understanding of this report.

At the date of preparing this report, no data are available from the Labour Force survey that map the new edition of classification of occupations (2011) and the classification of economic activities

But, they are not defined by any of them. In particular, they are not the sum total of related classification codes. These conceptual categories – at this high level of aggregation – may be comparable at international level as well.

(NACE REV. 2). However, data from the same survey dealing with the previous edition of classification of occupations and the NACE 2002 are presented in the annex. They show the economic activities corresponded to each category (4th digit) of classification on occupations as declared by the interviewed occupied persons. In order to facilitate the understanding of the reader, mappings to the occupation units of the new edition of classification of occupations are made (obviously for the occupation units remained unchanged between the previous edition and the new one). The corresponding economic activities are listed in descending order. Some of them are presented, representing generally 50-60 percent of cumulative frequency. Other selected NACE items are listed as well showing the respective range out of the total of economic activities listed per each category code of occupation classification.

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Broadcast technicians are classified at the same class with audio-visual technicians for the purpose of this report on culture occupations. It is obvious that these occupations are part of the area of communications engineering (electrical engineering) and not the AV media in a strict sense. In terms of user metadata, the structure relates to the domains of broadcast and reception technology, radio broadcast and radio technology (high frequency technology).

The correspondence table of culture occupations by categories (4th level) and occupation units (5th level) to ISCO-08 codes is supplied in the annex (Table 2).
