

Air travel in Italy

Year 2011

The National Institute of Statistics makes available statistics on air transport for the year 2011. The survey on air transport is carried out in accordance with EC Regulation 437/2003 of the European Parliament and the Council of 27 February 2003. The survey is a census and collects information from airport management companies, with the collaboration of the National Civil Aviation Authority (ENAC). Data covers the airport traffic of aircraft, passengers, freight and mail, incoming and/or departing from domestic airports, with regard to civil aviation business. In this note the main results of the survey are presented, with reference to the comparison between the domestic and international air traffic. Methodological aspects are explained in the informative note. Definitions are included in the glossary (in Italian only).

The national and international air traffic in 2011

In 2011, total air traffic at the national airports recorded a positive trend: aircraft arrived and departed, over the previous year, increased by 0.2%, passengers by 6.4% and cargo and mail carried by 1.2% (Table 1). For passengers, the increase is due both to national traffic (+6.9%) and international traffic (+6.4%). The reduction in the use of charter flights is relevant for the international traffic (-14.9%) and less for domestic market (-7.6%).

The evolution of airport traffic from 2002 to 2011

In 2011, air traffic marked a substantial recovery, regaining part of the decline of the period of crises (2008-2009): movements were up by 0.2% in 2011, continuing the increase registered in 2010 (+3.0%), and transportation of cargo and mail increased by 1.2% (Table 2). Even if the trends were positive in 2011, air traffic is still 6% lower than in 2007.

Regarding the number of passengers, the marked increase in 2011 (+6.4%) was in line with the increase of the previous year (+7.0%); the number of passengers transported in Italy has exceeded the maximum reached in 2010.

The transport of freight and mail

In 2011, air transport recorded a total traffic of freight and mail loaded and unloaded, on scheduled and charter flights, of about 890 thousand tons, with an increase by 1.3% over the previous year (Table 3). The overall increase of goods transported is due to international flights (2.5%), while the domestic market decrease by 7.5%.

The transportation of goods is carried out predominantly on scheduled flights (about 845 thousand tons) and less on non-scheduled flights (about 46 thousand tons). The transport on scheduled flights increased by 17.5% over the previous year, while on non-scheduled flights decreased by 71.6%.

The national and international traffic (Table 4) is concentrated in the two hubs of Milan Malpensa (with a share of 50.6%) and Rome Fiumicino (17.1%), and in the airport of Bergamo (12.6%), with a total share of 80%.

Compared to 2010, the share of the total freight and mail transported at Milan Malpensa increased by 1.4 percentage points (+88.1 thousand tons), Bergamo by 0.6 points (+6.5 thousand tons), while Rome Fiumicino decreased by 1.6 points (-12.5 thousand tons).
